

YOUR ESIA BOARD ENGAGES IN THE CITY'S GENERAL PLAN

The City Council will consider "key strategies" for the update to the General Plan and Community Plans on January 19. Of particular interest to East Sacramento is the strategy to provide for a greater array of housing types in existing single-unit neighborhoods by allowing duplexes, triplexes, and fourplexes in all neighborhoods. ESIA is engaged by working on a comment letter to the City Council and working with our councilmember and city staff. While we support new housing choices in our neighborhood, we are concerned about the current proposal. We are offering an alternative that would focus new housing on commercial

corridors, underused commercial and industrial properties, corner lots, and community facilities such as markets and medical facilities. We plan to engage our members on this issue as it moves forward.

Another strategy that we will comment on is the initiative to transition to all-electric appliances and HVAC systems. This strategy is intended to address greenhouse gas emissions from fossil fuels like



natural gas. We have concerns about the financial impact on property owners and renters when gas appliances and HVAC have be replaced and may need to be converted to electric. The potential requirement is not imminent and we will continue to monitor.
