## Guest Presentations – invited guests and ESIA members welcome

1. Jeff Harris, District 3 Councilmember, will describe the proposal to convert the Motel 6 on Alhambra Boulevard into a homeless shelter and answer questions.

Councilmember Harris first provided an update on the Sutter's Landing bathroom. He also gave an update on Measure G which he opposes.

Harris provided an overview of the Motel 6 conversion to a homeless shelter. Key points include:

- It would be operated initially as interim shelter for 18 months with the goal of converting to permanent housing, similar to Capital Park.
- The City lacks many tools for addressing homelessness and can't accommodate more people unless beds are available.
- Capitol Park does not receive many complaints and is managed by Volunteers of America. It is not a lockdown facility and they have not experienced on-site drug sales. Many services are provided.
- SHRA provided a list of distressed motels, including Motel 6. Motel 6 has a long history for drugs and prostitution.
- \$10 million in funds are available once Capitol Park is converted to permanent housing.
- Motel 6 would not be low barrier. The City will need a management plan from Volunteers of America with many services.
- Navigation to shelters would go through Sacramento Steps Forward.
- Railroad facility is low barrier and many lessons have been learned; mixed reviews on its success.
- The Alhambra X will be low barrier and is planned to open this spring. City needs to manage street feeding.
- Camping would not be allowed within <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> radius of Motel 6, if it is converted to a shelter..
- Harris' idea for addressing homelessness is to take a multifaceted approach with dispersal throughout the City; difficult to have large shelters that serve large numbers.

- The proposal is in its early planning stages. He is not sure if the deal with Motel 6 will actually happen.
- *He will have community outreach and will have answers to questions about operations and management.*
