# East Sacramento Improvement Association Regular Monthly Board Meeting November 4, 2013 MINUTES

In attendance: Louise Buford, David Diepenbrock, Ann Hamel, Tom Griffith, Paul Noble, Cyril Shah, and Knight Smart.

#### **Guest Presentation**

1. Presentation by Bill Camp on a community benefits agreement for the new arena. Bill explained that the Central Labor Council is working to achieve the following with regard to the proposed downtown arena: (1) allow people working at the current (Sleep Train) arena to have the first shot at the same positions at the new arena; (2) allow workers to decide whether to join the union, but the union would sign a "labor peace" agreement that would prohibit picketing and strikes; (3) provide "sustainable wages" based on WIB data; (4) provide late night transportation; (5) provide high quality training; (6) implement a policy of hiring first from areas with the highest levels of unemployment; (7) provide space for childcare services for employees; and (8) build a public meeting room. Bill said he was looking for ESIA support for the union conducting negotiations with the new owners.

### **Old Business**

- 4. Recap of October 16 general membership meeting. The meeting was very well attended. It was noted that the CalTrans presenter was unpersuasive. Board members question the efficacy of the proposed E Street closure, and the negative impacts the closure would have on neighborhood traffic conditions.
- 5. Status update on the 41st Street construction project. David and Paul provided a general update of the work performed on the appeal, and the need to have a strong turnout for the Planning Commission hearing.
- 6. McKinley Village. Board members agreed that we should start developing a list of conditions or improvements that should be implemented. The Board also noted that in light of the delayed release of the Draft EIR, there would be time to re-visit

the issue of hiring a traffic engineer to assist with the analysis and comments on traffic issues.

### **New Business**

- 7. Discussion Bill Camp presentation. The Board decided that ESIA should not take a position on the Central Labor Council's work on this issue.
- 8. Resolution of support for appeal by 41<sup>st</sup> Street neighbors. The resolution Paul prepared supporting the appeal passed unanimously.
- 9. Demolition Investigation & Report Application for 3001 G Street. The Board agreed that demolition applications should first be reviewed first by the Land Use Committee.
- 10. Possible Board turnover. Paul's term is up in June 2014. He agreed to ask other Board members about their plans for staying on the Board for another term.
- 11. New Projects. The Board discussed working to change the Zoning Code to help prevent a recurrence of the situation at 1112 41<sup>st</sup> Street, investigating the creation of a Design District, and talking with the City's preservation director.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 7:10 p.m.
