Dear Sir or Madam:

We're responding to your request dated May 25, 2022, about your tax-exempt status.

We issued you a determination letter in March 2014, recognizing you as tax-exempt under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 501(c)(4).

Because you're not an organization described in IRC Section 170(c), donors can't deduct contributions they make to you. You should advise your contributors that their contributions to you aren't deductible.

In the heading, we indicated whether you must file an annual information return. If you're required to file a return, you must file one of the following by the 15th day of the 5th month after the end of your annual accounting period.

- Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax
- Form 990-EZ, Short Form Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax
- Form 990-N, Electronic Notice (e-Postcard) for Tax-Exempt Organizations Not Required to File Form 990 or Form 990EZ
- Form 990-PF, Return of Private Foundation or Section 4947(a)(1) Trust Treated as Private Foundation

According to IRC Section 6033(j), if you don't file a required annual information return or notice for 3 consecutive years, we'll revoke your tax-exempt status on the due date of the 3rd required return or notice.
